2/16/2021	kidnapping, assault	3	A Honduran man, his wife, and their two-year-old daughter in MPP were kidnapped in Nuevo Laredo in February 2020 on the way to their hearing and held for a week and taken to different houses. They hadn't taken phones with them because they had been advised not to take phones to the hearing in case they were kidnapped. The cartel members who kidnapped them demanded that they provide a phone number of a relative who could pay ransom but they didn't have any numbers memorized. The kidnapers separated them and told the woman they had killed her husband for not providing a number and told the man they had killed his wife for not providing a number. They beat both and held a gun to the two-year-old daughter's head to force the parents to provide a phone number. Eventually, they released the family and it took them days to figure out where they were and get back to the main street. They missed their hearing because of the kidnapping. 2/16/2021	kidnapping, sexual assault	1	A 28-year-old woman from Ecuador in MPP was kidnapped in November 2019 and held for three months because her family wasn't able to pay ransom. She was sexually abused while she was kidnapped. When she was eventually released, she was terrified and didn't want anyone to get near her.	HRF telephonic interview with asylum seeker
2/16/2021	attempted kidnapping	2	A woman in MPP and her thirteen-year-old were nearly kidnapped on three separate occasions in Nuevo Laredo.	HRF telephonic interview with pastor assisting migrants in Nuevo Laredo
