

During the first ten months of Fiscal Year 2018 (October 1, 2017 – July 31, 2018), the United States **resettled 18,214 refugees, an almost 70% decrease from the 50,479 refugees settled during the first ten months of Fiscal Year 2017.**<sup>1</sup> The below chart illustrates state-by-state admissions through the ten month point of Fiscal Years 2017 and 2018.

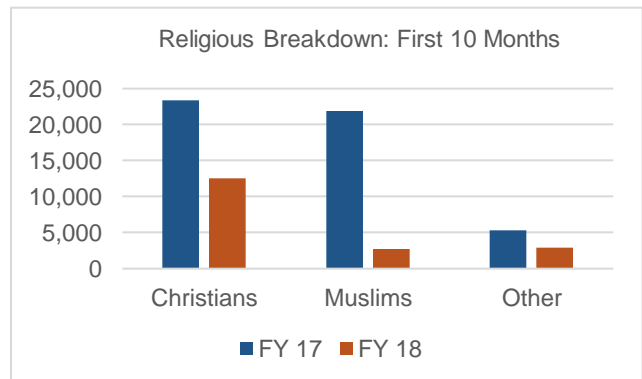

Although there have been decreases in admissions across all religions, **during the first ten months of the fiscal year, admissions for Muslims were down by almost 90% compared to the first ten months of FY17.** During the first ten months of FY 2017, **Muslims comprised 43% of admitted refugees, compared to 15% of admitted refugees during the first ten months of FY 2018.**

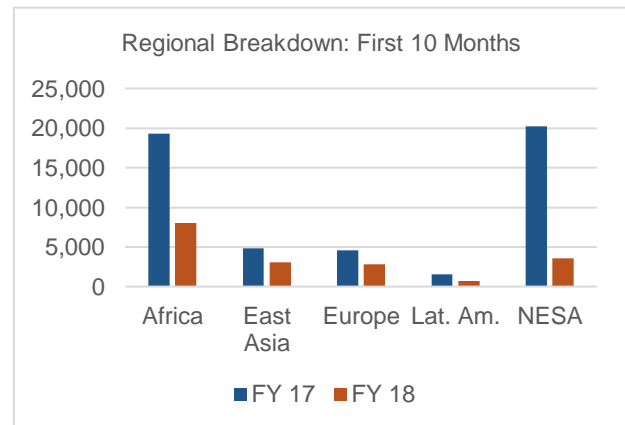

Following the Muslim and Travel Bans, which barred refugees from 10 Muslim majority countries from entering the United States, **only 543 refugees from the 11 banned countries have been admitted to the U.S. during the first ten months of Fiscal Year 2018**, compared to the **22,562 admitted during the first ten months of Fiscal Year 2017**.

Despite record breaking levels of global displacement,<sup>3</sup> **overall refugee admissions in the United States are down by almost 70% from last fiscal year**. Notably, admissions from Near East and South Asia, Africa, and Latin America and the Caribbean are experiencing large drops in admissions.
