

Federal Courts Continue to Take Lead in Counterterrorism Prosecutions

- ☑ Number of individuals convicted of terrorism-related offenses in federal courts since 9/11: 668¹
- ☑ Number of district courts in which terrorism-related convictions have been secured: 67
- ☑ Number of states in which terrorism-related convictions have been secured: 40²
- ☑ Courts with most convictions:
 - Eastern District of New York (Brooklyn, Long Island) **69**
 - Southern District of New York (Manhattan, White Plains) **65**
 - Eastern District of Virginia (Alexandria, Richmond) **59**
 - Eastern District of Michigan (Detroit) **46**
 - Southern District of Florida (Miami, Ft. Lauderdale) **33**
 - District of Minnesota **33**
- ☑ Most common charges and convictions (individuals may be charged and convicted of more than one crime and may be counted multiple times below):
 - Terrorism: Providing material support or resources to designated foreign terrorist organizations (18 U.S.C. § 2339B). Individuals charged: 237 Individuals convicted: 205
 - Conspiracy: Conspiracy to commit offense or to defraud United States (18 U.S.C. § 371). Individuals charged: 167 Individuals convicted: 116
 - Terrorism: Providing material support to terrorists (18 U.S.C. § 2339A). Individuals charged: 117 Individuals convicted: 90
 - Fraud and false statements: Statements or entries generally (18 U.S.C. § 1001). Individuals charged: 112 Individuals convicted: 77
 - Racketeering: Laundering of monetary instruments (18 U.S.C. § 1956). Individuals charged: 76 Individuals convicted: 44
- ☑ Total number of terrorism-related charges available in federal court: 133
- ☑ Total number of charges available under the Military Commissions Act: 30
- ☑ Percentage of convictions in which subject was captured abroad: 17% (113 individuals)³
